1. Objectives

The report gives a summary of findings of the survey on the non-academic background of new local undergraduate students admitted by Lingnan University in 2022-23. The findings may facilitate the planning of student services and facilities. 2. Methodology

The survey was conducted from August to October 2022. All new full-time local undergraduate students were invited to complete the survey via Moodle platform. Participation was entirely voluntary.
